
\mathcal{B}_{ank} \mathcal{V}_{iew} \mathcal{F}_{arm} : Luxury Bed & Breakfast Walk 10 : Enjoy Spectacular Rocks Around the Burbage Valley

3 miles / 5km – Approx. 1.5 hours

A wonderful walk with unique rock formation and an Iron Age Fort to explore, but tricky underfoot and boggy in places. Need decent boots.



This walk sets out from Upper Burbage Bridge car park. If you drive up through Dore Village to Ringinglow, then turn left at Ringinglow and the car park is in two miles on your left.

There is a gate and path out of the left of the car park. Follow this and keep to the right (do not drop down into the valley). The path is quite rocky but follow this along the top enjoying views across the valley to your left.

1. At the end of the rocky edge you drop steeply down and follow the main path which soon climb back up to Higger Tor. This hill has wonderful rock formations which are worth exploring.

2. Follow Higger Tor keeping the valley on your left. You reach a point where you will have a rocky scramble down to rejoin a good path towards Carl Wark.

3. As you approach Carl Wark you can see the very

well preserved Iron Age fortifications. The walk takes the path on the left just before Carl Wark but it is worth going up to explore the old hill fort. Drop down into the valley. Try to stay to the right as this path gets very boggy and the firmer ground is on the right.

- At the bottom the of the valley cross the little stone bridge and climb up until you hit a large track. Turn left onto this and then turn right in a few yards. This track climbs up steeply between the Burbage North and Burbage South edges.
- 5. At the top of the track keep left and follow the Burbage North Edge with the valley on your left.
- 6. At the top of the valley the track drops down to cross two streams and then climbs back up to the car park where you started.

You have now earned an ice cream from the ice cream van which is usually in the car park.
